


IF AN AIRBAG IS FITTED IN THE SEATING POSITION WHERE THE CHILD RESTRAINT IS TO BE FITTED, FOLLOW THE VEHICLE MANUFACTURERS WARNINGS AND INSTRUCTIONS.

The restraint should not be purchased or sold as a second hand item. It is recommended not to use child restraints older than 10 years as the protection in an accident may be reduced.

This restraint must be used in conjunction with a lap or lap-sash seatbelt.

Seatbelt extenders are not recommended to be used if the seatbelt is not long enough to secure the child restraint. If seatbelts are too short then seek advice from a child restraint fitter and consider their recommendations before using a seatbelt extender.

Vehicle information Location of anchor fitting



- The anchor point can be found in different locations in different cars. The diagram above shows possible locations of anchor points. Sometimes it is on the parcel shelf in sedans, and on the floor area in station wagons, vans and hatchbacks. Make sure that you do not confuse the luggage hook in the back of a station wagon with anchor points. Refer to your owner's manual.
- An extension strap may be needed for vehicles without a fixed parcel shelf.



For cars fitted with a child restraint upper anchorage point:


Locate the upper anchorage point behind the rear seating position (consult the car owner's handbook for the location of the upper anchorage point).

Remove the thread plug from the parcel shelf/floor/roof and install the attachment bolt as shown in **Figure 1**.

CAUTION: DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN THE ATTACHMENT BOLT. OVER TIGHTENING MAY FRACTURE OR BREAK BOLT. MAXIMUM TORQUE IS 20 Nm.

Upper anchorage installation for sedans only



FOR CARS NOT FITTED WITH A CHILD RESTRAINT UPPER ANCHORAGE POINT:

For sedans only:

Drill a 9mm diameter hole in the parcel shelf on the centre-line of the seating position as shown in **Figure 2**. Install the anchor bolt as shown in **Figure 3**. It is recommended that this installation be carried out by a child restraint fitting station or licenced motor mechanic.

For vehicles other than sedans:

In Australia, consult your nearest child restraint fitting station or traffic authority for vehicle inspection to find the best, correct position for the placement of the upper anchorage point, and for the correct attachment bolt length and use of spacers. In New Zealand, consult the agent for the vehicle.

CHILD RESTRAINTS MUST NOT BE ATTACHED TO UNSOUND METAL OR TO WOOD OR SYNTHETIC STRUCTURES. WHEN DRILLING THE 9MM HOLE DO NOT DRILL THROUGH FUEL LINES, FUEL TANKS, ELECTRICAL WIRING, OR RADIO SPEAKERS. WEBBING STRAPS MUST BE PROTECTED FROM SHARP CORNERS AND EDGES. THE ANCHOR FITTING MUST BE USED ONLY AS DESCRIBED ABOVE. IT MUST NOT BE HOOKED ONTO ANY OTHER OBJECT.





Shoulder height markers



IMPORTANT: FOLLOW THIS ADVICE

Marker A: Older child



Upper Shoulder Height Marker

When the child's shoulders reach this upper marker, or the child no longer fits in the child restraint, approximately 8 years of age, then the child must be moved to the next form of child restraint.

Marker B : Young toddler



Lower Shoulder Height Marker

The child's shoulders must be in-line or above this marker. If the child's shoulders are below then the child should remain in their previous child restraint.

Operation and adjustment

Next seat for your child

When your child has outgrown the seat, you can either use: A booster seat suitable for children up to 8-10 years of age until their shoulders reach the upper height marker of the booster seat.

NOTE: THIS ILLUSTRATION IS REPRESENTATIVE ONLY.

Alternatively, follow the steps below to see if your child is ready to use a vehicle seat belt.

If your child is transitioning out of a booster, try this simple three point test. You may find that your child is not yet ready to use an adult seatbelt without the booster.

Three point test

Incorrect Correct Sash on shoulder and not on neck Legs are not long enough so child is slumping in seat or face Lap belt low Sash part across across hips and neck and face not stomach and not shoulder Legs long enough to bend at knee no slumping Lap belt across stómach and not low on hips

- 1. Does the sash part of the seat belt sit on the middle of the shoulder and not touch the neck or face?
- 2. Does the lap part of the seat belt sit low down on the hips and not on the abdomen?
- 3. When you sit the child on the seat with their bottom all the way back, are their thighs long enough for their knees to bend allowing the legs to hang over the front of the seat?

If you answered "no" to any of these questions, your child needs to be in a booster seat to make both the sash and the lap part of the seat belt fit right to ensure maximum crash protection.

Operation and adjustment Preparing harness for child fitment



To Loosen Harness:

- 1. Lift the harness release lever at the front of the seat (between trim cover opening).
- 2. Pull both shoulder straps simultaneously to loosen harness.

To Tighten Harness:

3. Pull the harness adjustor strap at the front of the seat until the shoulder straps lay firmly against the child.



Fitting the harness to your child:

- 1. Loosen the harness and release the buckle by pressing the red button.
- 2. Place the child in the seat, fasten the buckle assembly.
- 3. Pull the harness adjustor strap to tighten


Operation and adjustment Headrest and harness height adjustment

IMPORTANT: Always loosen the harness before moving the headrest up. Adjusting the headrest will automatically adjust the harness height as well.



To Adjust:

 Push the button located at the top of the headrest and lift up or down to the desired height.



IMPORTANT: The shoulder straps must be in the slots which are nearest to the child's shoulders, but not more than 25mm below the child's shoulders.

Operation and adjustment Headrest Comfort Adjustment

IMPORTANT: Always activate the headrest before you start your journey always take safety precautions when using this feature, it is not recommended to activate this feature when vehicle is in motion.



Activating the comfort headrest:

1. Locate the headrest leaver on either side of the headrest.

2. Turn the leaver to activate the comfort support wings (as shown).

To close:

3. Turn leaver back to original position.

Operation and adjustment Crotch buckle height and length adjustment

NOTE: The crotch adjuster can be accessed when the seat is installed in recline position and adjusted hassle free in the vehicle.



To Adjust:

1. Locate the adjustor pin and slide each side into the next position.

Position 1: is for smaller children up to 3 years approx

Position 2: is for 3-6 years approx

Position 3: is for 6-8 years approx

NOTE: The seat is fitted with a 3 position crotch adjustment. When changing to the next position the crotch height and depth with both automatically be adjusted automatically. Please adjust the crotch position as your child grows.



Cup holders:

Cup holders are located on either side of the car seat. Swing out to use and swing back in to stow away when not in use.

Operation and adjustment Fastening the buckle assembly






2. Insert one buckle tongue as shown above (you will not hear a click).



3. Insert the second buckle tongue as illustrated above. Now listen for a **'CLICK'**.



4. Remember to always pull up on the harness straps to make sure buckle is locked tightly.

\land WARNING

To Loosen Top Tether:

- Press the grey button and pull on the main top tether strap with the top tether hook attached to it.
- 2. Ensure to loosen and check that you have enough top tether slack to attach to your vehicles top anchorage location before beginning the installation process.



To Tighten Top Tether:

3. To tighten top tether strap, press grey button and pull on the free end of the tether to tighten. Always stow excess tether in the pocket provided.







NOTE: There is an option to install the seat using seat belt locking clip. Please see instructions provided with locking clip for installation.

Care and maintenance

Cleaning the buckle

Follow the manufacturer's instructions at all times.

Your child car seat is equipped with a buckle designed to give your child maximum protection during proper use. When working properly, your buckle should always fasten with an audible 'CLICK'.

If sticky liquids (such as baby food, fruit juice, etc.) get into the buckle it may become sluggish and you will not hear a 'CLICK'.

The buckle should be cleaned by following the steps below.





1. Start by moving the crotch position into position number 3.

2. You can remove the seat trim cover so it does not get wet or dirty during the cleaning process.

3. Fill any shallow container with 40 $^\circ\mathrm{C}$ water.

4. Lay the buckle gently into the container and let it soak for 30 mins.

5. Simultaneously latch and unlatch the buckle tongues into the buckle several times until a strong audible CLICK is heard.

6. If you cannot hear an audible CLICK then repeat steps 1 - 4 above again.

7. Allow the buckle to completely dry before fitting on the trim.

CAUTION: DO NOT OIL ANY PART OF THE BUCKLE. WATER MAY BE HOT SO PROCEED WITH CARE.

Care and maintenance

Removing the seat cover for cleaning

NOTE: Style and design may vary

All covers are machine washable on a delicate cycle, in cold water.

Don't forget to remove the instruction manual.

Tumble dry 10-15 minutes on low heat.

Do not dry clean.

All other surfaces should be cleaned with a mild soap and water.

Never clean with bleach or spirit-type cleaners.

Do not use the restraint without the cover.

Check the webbing for fraying.



To remove insert:

To remove the padded insert, undo the buckle and pull the insert out.

To replace insert:

Feed the crotch part of the buckle through the opening slot in the insert and fasten buckle assembly.



To remove belt mates:

To remove the belt mates, simply undo press studs and unwrap from harness straps.

To replace belt mates:

Fit belt mates to harness straps by wrapping around straps and closing press studs.

Care and maintenance Removing the seat cover for cleaning



To remove the trim:

To remove the trim start by releasing the press studs located on the back of the seat as well as the Velco webbing straps located under the seat. Then gently pull the trim free from the shell around the armrests and up through the top of the seat.

To replace the trim:

Follow the steps above in the reverse order



To remove the headrest:

To remove the headrest, lift the headrest to the highest position and release the press studs and Velcro tabs on the back of the headrest. Then release the 4 press studs located on the top and bottom of the headrest trim.

To replace the headrest:

Follow the steps above in the reverse order.

Fit belt mates to harness straps by wrapping around straps and closing press studs.

IMPORTANT: ALWAYS REMOVE THE AIR BAGS FROM THE HEADREST TRIM BEFORE WASHING.

VERY IMPORTANT:

Only replace the cover with a manufacturer's supplied replacement cover with identical shoulder height markers or a replacement cover meeting AS/NZS 8005.
